FACT SHEET – 2017 “RACE” RIDERS SCHOOLS

RACE Schools are designed for those riders who are anxious to test their skill in organized wheel to wheel competition during 2017 RACE events . All riders must attend a school before they can apply for a RACE Competition License. Riders under 18 years of age should contact the RACE office for information regarding the underage consent form before they can apply.

LOCATION: Shannonville Motorsport Park – Take the 401 east of Belleville, to the Shannonville; exit south to Hwy # 2 , turn left ; track is located approx 4 miles on the left. Or take the 401 west of Kingston, to the Marysville exit south to Hwy # 2; turn right; track is located approx 2 miles on the right.

COST: \$ 265.48 + 34.52 (HST) = \$300.00

MACHINE PREPARATION:

It is suggested, although not a requirement, that all students ride a “street “type, road legal machine. This course is also offered to street riders to improve their riding skills. Students who require specialized “street riders “instruction will be provided a separate instructor for this purpose. All students are not required to be of racing calibre in order to participate in a RACE School. It is recommended that students taking the school should use either their street bike for the “street riders “instruction or a bike that they are familiar with or feel most comfortable on. Riders participating in the “racers instructions “are not required to have a “Race Bike “for the school. The purpose of the school is to allow each student an opportunity to work on their riding skills, and taking the school aboard a high – strung racing machine could seriously limit and or impair your track time.

- Each student must arrive in the morning ready to go.
- All bikes must be in a safe roadworthy condition.
- All kickstands (both side and center) should be removed on race prepped bikes; this is not mandatory for the “street riders instruction “but recommended.
- The following must be taped over or removed – all glass lenses on instruments (except tach). Reflectors, head and tail lights and turn signals
- Each bike should have a functioning engine kill switch.
- Side view mirrors must be removed

Each rider’s bike and riders clothing and protective gear will be inspected prior to that student taking part in any track session.

RIDING GEAR:

The following items must be supplied by all RACE school students to be worn during the on – track portion of the school.

- Snell 2010 or Equivalent, Approved by RACE (full faced) helmet.
- Full leathers, either one piece racing suit or suitable two – piece zip together
- Leather boots & leather riding gloves
- No jeans or non – leather motocross clothing will be accepted
- All equipment must be in good / safe condition, subject to approval.
- RACE is not responsible for any damage to a riders bike or personal gear

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The RACE rider’s school began in 1981 and was the first type to be held in Canada, offering both classroom and on – track in – depth instruction. RACE has developed the schools to allow motorcycle enthusiasts a safe informative opportunity to develop and refine their street riding and racing skills.

A morning classroom session will cover bike preparation, rider requirements, basic rules and regulations. Safety lecture concerning Flags & track procedures. RACE rules and regulations & procedures. Mental & physical preparation. Bike requirements & technical inspection. Accelerating & braking techniques as well as cornering procedures and crash avoidance. Students are required to de-brief with their instructors after each track session.

Following the classroom portion of the school, students will join their designated small groups for a track walk with their instructors. After a short break followed by a mandatory riders meeting, the groups will begin their track sessions for the balance of the afternoon. Riders groups are based upon experience, ability, & equipment. Students are required to complete at least 80 % of the school day in order to be eligible to receive school certification.
